April 10, 2015 Growing Degree Day issue

Reminder: We are now on an every other week schedule for the newsletter. On alternate weeks, we will still make growing degree day information available in a special "Growing Degree Day issue".

What indicator plant is in bloom at the Arboretum?

Corneliancherry Dogwood (Cornus mas) is in early flower.

Accumulated Growing Degree Days (Base 50): 14 (as of April 9)
Accumulated Growing Degree Days (Base 30): 368.5 (as of April 9)

Special Note: Soil temperatures are fluctuating up and down, but are going above 55 degrees on some days. Now would be the time to apply a crabgrass preventer.
