## What indicator plant is in bloom at the Arboretum?

Eastern Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*) is in early flower and serviceberry (*Amelanchier* species) buds are swelling.

Accumulated Growing Degree Days (Base 50): 66.5 (as of April 23) Accumulated Growing Degree Days (Base 30): 676 (as of April 23)

## Degree Days and Weather Information

As of April 23, we are at 66.5 base-50 growing degree days (GDD). The historical average (1937-2013) for this date is 19  $GDD_{50}$ .
